

Different Types of People

1. Angry People	Aggressive, antagonistic, argumentative, confrontational, destructive, explosive, hostile, intimidating, threatening, vicious or even violent
2. Anxious people	Catastrophizers, dejected, miserable, pessimists, sad, scared, terrified, timid, unhappy or worriers
3. Apologetic people	Feeling sorry so often
4. Biased people	Bigots, close minded, prejudiced, rigid, unfair or making sweeping assumptions or generalizations
5. Blamers	Blame other people or circumstances, or just not take responsibility for their own actions
6. Boring people	Burblers, digressers, rambler, tedious, unfocused, wafflers
7. Bullies	Aggressive, belittling, bombastic, bossy, dictatorial, haranguing, harassing, intimidating, oppressive, pressurising, railroading, threatening, plain unkind, or all these
8. Change resistant people	Conservative, inflexible, risk averse, unadventurous, unimaginative, or indeed just calm and patient
9. Charmers	Attractive, charismatic, seductive, slick, slimy or smarmy, or quite possibly all of these together
10. Cold people	Thick skinned, unaffectionate, unemotional, unempathetic, uninvolved, or possibly even insensitive or brutal
11. Competitive people	Winners, always present everywhere, very confident
12. Confused people	Unsettled, not concentrating
13. Difficult people	Plain contrary, disagreeable, disharmonious, not interested
14. Disobedient people	Negative, uncomfortable, not responsible
15. Dumpers	Mistakenly believe they are delegators
16. Embarrassed people	Belittle themselves or their achievements, excessively modest, quite, reluctant to accept praise/compliments, scared to speak up, self deprecating, self effacing, shy
17. Forgetful people	Miss the D days, prone to losing things
18. Hostile people	Alienating, antagonistic, argumentative, confrontational, disloyal, disrespectful, rude, ridiculing, sarcastic, uncooperative, unfriendly, vindictive
19. Impatient people	Complainers, intolerant, unreasonable
20. Impetuous, impulsive people	Blurting, leaping, quicky,
21. Indecisive people	Find it hard to take decisions, procrastinate
22. Insecure people	Fragile, introverted, loners, needing constant reassurance, timid, over sensitive, unconfident, low self esteem, low self confidence
23. Insincere people	Deceivers, liars, manipulators, tricksters, two faced, untrustworthy
24. Last minuters	Leave things until the last moment

25. Late people	Constantly miss deadlines, unpunctual, unreliable
26. Loners	Keep to themselves, not obvious team players
27. Messy people	Disorganized, untidy, inconsistent, not very visual
28. Moody people	Temperamental, unpredictable, unreliable, sensitive
29. Negative people	Dampeners, pessimists, But-ters, wet blankets
30. Nit picky people	Who tend to find faults
31. Patronizing people	Arrogant, belittling, insensitive, pompous, self important, smug, snobbish, thick skinned, unobservant, or all these at once
32. Phobic people	Fearful, frightened, scared or terrified of say, presenting in public
33. Repeaters	Who keep repeating themselves
34. Scatter gun thinkers	Unfocused(Multi focused), unpredictable, flit from idea to idea
35. Selfish people	Inconsiderate, self centred, self obsessed
36. Show offs	Attention seekers, cocky, extreme extraverts, full of themselves
37. Stressed people	Anxious, fretful, pressured, tense, worried
38. Unassertive people	Too compliant, malleable, subservient or weak
39. Unenthusiastic people	Low on ambition, 'Drive', excitement, inspiration, motivation, optimism or passion
40. Unfulfilled people	Failures, inadequate, sad, underachievers or unsatisfied
41. Unmotivated people	Do the minimum, need telling every single thing to do, clock watchers, demotivated, disengaged, uninterested, incurious, lethargic, reluctant, slow, timeservers, uninvolved, unwilling
42. Unrealistic people	Overpromising others and kidding themselves
43. Untrusting people	Cautious, cynical, hard to convince, sceptical or suspicious
44. Workaholics	Run themselves into the ground, working long hours,
45. YES people	Agree with everything & have no real opinions of their own
